Horticulture Information Leaflet 636

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SHRUBS 8+ FEET HIGH FOR NORTH CAROLINA LANDSCAPES

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There are many excellent large landscape plants for all of North Carolina. Practical uses would include large plants as screening plantings or tall specimen or accent plants. The modern practice of "tree form" shrubs is best realized from plants in this category. Foundation plantings can also be implemented where the buildings/structures are very large in scale. Typically, this would be municipal, commercial or industrial projects.

The plants in this category offer both deciduous and evergreen choices, flowering and berry producing plants, along with cultivars with interesting bark and foliage textures. When properly selected and located, the plants in this category will certainly enhance the landscape setting. As many of these plants are fast growing and can easily reach 15 to 20 feet in height, be sure to give them the required growing space.

ENGLISH HOLLY								
Ilex cornuta	7,8	E	moderate	sun or part shade	medium/ coarse	rounded upright	<u>10-15'</u> 8-10'	Often used as a small tree will become overgrown on small residential sites. 'Burfordii' is a favorite cultivar.

<i>Ligustrum japonicum</i> JAPANESE PRIVET	7,8	E	rapid	sun or shade	coarse	erect, oval top	<u>10-15'</u> 6-8'	Large evergreen, tolerant of adverse conditions. Not a foundation plant

<i>Osmanthus fragrans</i> SWEET OSMANTHUS	7,8	E	moderate	sun	medium	upright rounded	<u>12-15'</u> 10-12'	Large specimen for open areas. Gets large in N.C. Is not very cold hardy.
<i>Osmanthus heterophyllus</i> HOLLY OSMANTHUS	7,8	E	moderate	sun	medium	upright irregular shape	<u>10-12'</u> 8-10'	Fall flowering, very fragrant. Several cultivars available
<i>Photinia glabra</i> JAPANESE PHOTINIA	7,8	E	rapid	sun	medium	upright loose	<u>10-12'</u> 6-8'	Smallest of photinias
<i>Photinia serrulata</i> CHINESE PHOTINIA	7,8	E	rapid	sun	coarse	broadly oval	<u>20-25'</u> 18-20'	Typical objectionable odor Should not be used in small designs. Can be a "small tree" form

PINXTERBLOOM AZALEA								
<i>Syringa persica</i>	6,7,8	D	rapid	sun	medium	global	<u>8-9'</u> 7-9'	Spring flowering - fragrant
PERSIAN LILAC								
<i>Syringa vulgaris</i>	6,7	D	moderate	sun	medium	upright with stiff ascending branches	<u>10-15'</u> 8-10'	Smaller than <i>S. vulgaris</i> Good spring flowering shrub or small tree - very fragrant.
COMMON LILAC								
<i>Tamarix gallica</i>	7,8	D	moderate	sun	fine	broad spreading open	<u>10-12'</u> 9-11'	Summer flowering. Generally associated with coastal areas
SALT CEDAR								
<i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	6,7	D	slow	sun	medium	upright multi-stemmed	<u>6-12'</u> 8-12'	Excellent hedge, beautiful fall color - edible fruit
HIGHBUSH BLUEBERRY								
<i>Viburnum dilatatum</i>	6,7,8	D	moderate	sun to part shade	medium	rounded dense	<u>9-10'</u> 6-8'	Many uses - nice flowers, showy berries in fall
LINDEN VIBURNUM								
<i>Viburnum rhytidophyllum</i>	6,7,8	E	moderate	sun to part shade	coarse	upright multi-stemmed	<u>10-15'</u> 12-15'	Retains leaves in winter - excellent foliage character
LEATHERLEAF VIBURNUM								
<i>V. plicatum tomentosum</i>	6,7,8	D	moderate	sun to part shade	coarse	broad spreading	<u>8-10'</u> 8-10'	Handsome accent plant
DOUBLEFILE VIBURNUM								
<i>Vitex negundo</i>	6,7,8	D	rapid	sun or part shade	medium/ fine	open, loosely branched	<u>12-15'</u> 8-10'	Large shrub or small tree. Purple flowers in later summer
